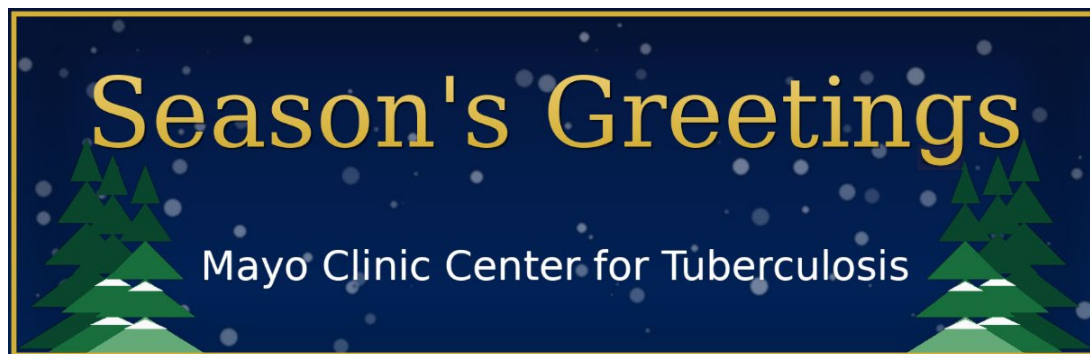

What's New in 2026

We're introducing three new learning opportunities this year. The **TB Program Management Intensive** is a two-day, in-person course for TB program managers and staff, covering leadership strategies and key topics like epidemiology, surveillance, contact investigation, and data-driven decision making. The **TB Contact Investigation Interviewing Skills** course helps public health staff strengthen interviewing techniques through practice and role play, including mock interviews and self-assessment. Finally, **LTBI 101 for Healthcare Professionals** is a self-paced course for those new to TB, offering practical skills to identify, treat, and monitor latent TB infection in line with CDC guidelines.

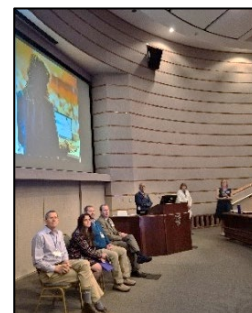
